As New York gives billions away to Amazon, and sits on billions in budget surplus, we still have an underfunded and segregated school system, while raises in the recent contract are falling behind the pace of inflation.

UFT Members and NYC students deserve better. Join MORE in our fight for:

LOWER CLASS SIZES THROUGH FAIR FUNDING FOR ALL SCHOOLS:

Mobilize for the \$1.5 billion owed to NYC schools and eliminate "Fair Student Funding" which discriminates against veteran educators.

END EVALUATION BY STANDARDIZED TESTS:

Recent legislation supported by the UFT leadership still requires districts to evaluate teachers based on an assessment approved by the state.

REVERSING THE GIVEBACKS ON HEALTH CARE:

Our union needs to organize members to fight to preserve our current care instead of continuing givebacks, and ultimately for single payer health care in New York State.

STRONG PROTECTIONS AGAINST HARASSMENT AND ABUSE:

We need both stronger contractual protections and a union that builds powerful chapters in our schools to stop abusive administrators.

PAY PARITY FOR ALL TITLES:

Many UFT members, especially para-professionals and Occupational and Physical Therapists remain woefully underpaid. We need parity now!

MORE DIVERSE TEACHING AND SUPPORT STAFF:


We need a union that will fight for the district to hire and retain teachers of color.


SUPPORT FOR ALL STUDENTS:

The UFT must fight for adequate numbers of counselors, social workers, restorative justice coordinators, and immigrant rights liaisons.

Here is what educators around the country were able to win by taking action as the wave of teacher strikes spreads across the country:

In Washington State, teachers strikes netted raises of up to 10% this fall

West Virginia teachers and school support workers earned an immediate 5% blanket pay increase statewide

Arizona teachers won a 19% pay raise after a 5-day strike

Los Angeles teachers won lower class sizes, more librarians, counselors, and nurses, and a 6% pay raise after their 6-day strike in January
