Bronx HES Field Day on June 7

Our chapter will again participate in the fifth annual HES Field Day on Friday, June 7, at Pelham Bay Park. This event was created to give students the opportunity to meet and engage with other deaf or hard-of-

hearing (DHH) students in the Bronx — from public, private and charter schools. Last year's 300 attendees included DHH students in grades K–12, hearing teachers, paraprofessionals, sign language interpreters and parents. There will be games, team sports, relay races, a student-designed T-shirt contest and a picnic lunch. For some of our students, this field day will mark their first interaction with other DHH students and adults — as well as their first exposure to different types of hearing loss. Students with hearing loss tend to feel isolated, both in and outside the classroom. The HES Field Day helps bridge that gap. We look forward to an even bigger and better event this year!

HES hosts Transition Fair on April 16

The UFT's Transition Fair attracted 250 students with hearing loss to UFT headquarters in Manhattan on April 16. This annual fair, sponsored by HES, is designed for all students who wish to further their education after high school. Our students met with representatives from Gallaudet University, the Rochester Institute of Technology, CUNY and other organizations, and also had the chance to socialize with their peers. It was a wonderful opportunity for our students, and I want to say "kudos" to HES for organizing it.
