

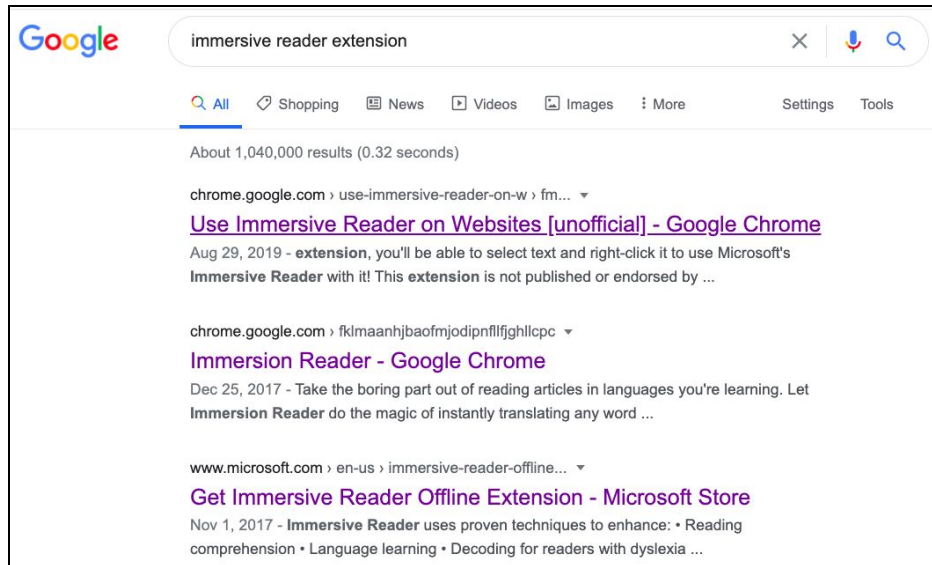

How to Use Immersive Reader on Websites

Launch Google Chrome Search
google.com

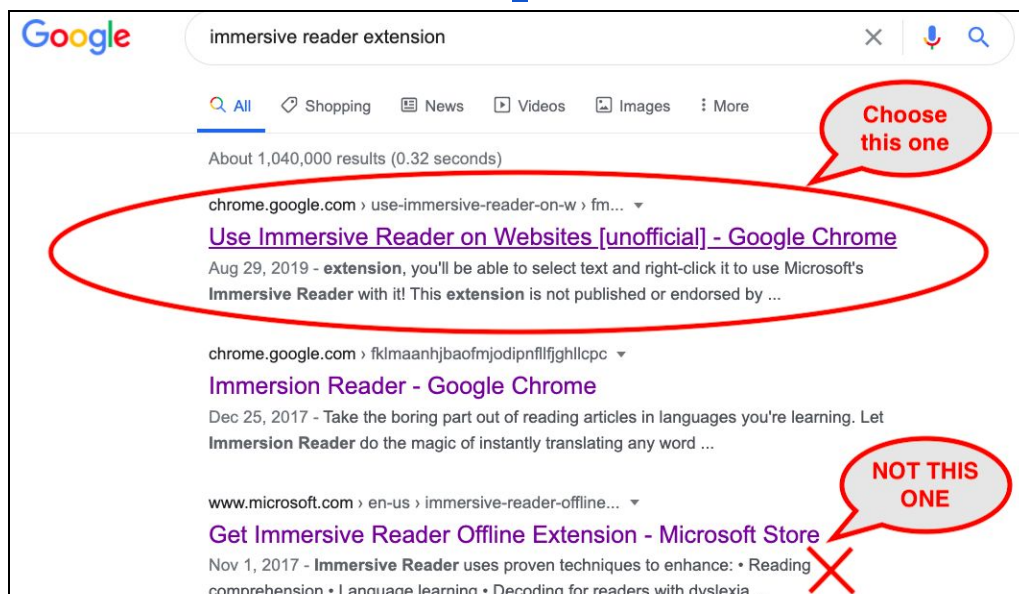
Type in the search box → Immersive Reader Extension



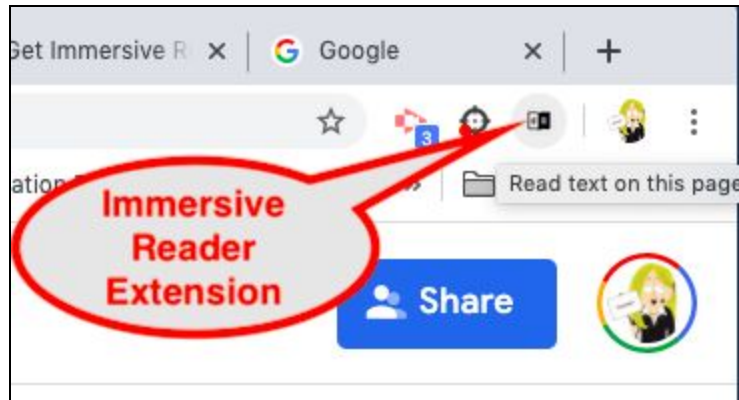
Choose the Unofficial Version

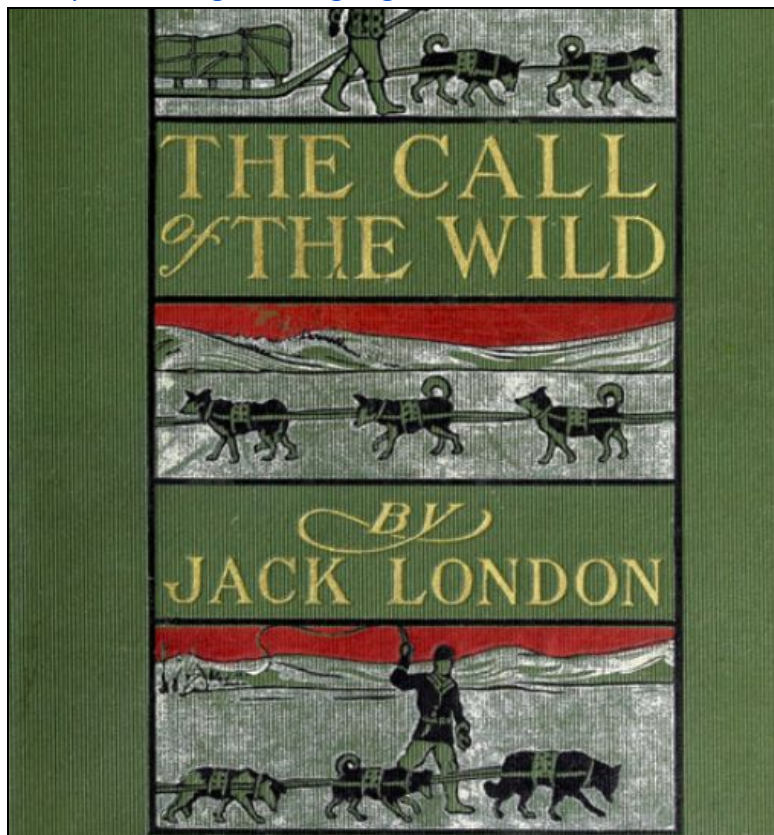
Click the Button to Add to Chrome
(You will see the extension added in the upper right-hand corner of the Chrome window)



Go to a website that has text (like Newsela) you want the students to read.

Example Text: The Call of the Wild, by Jack London - Project Gutenberg

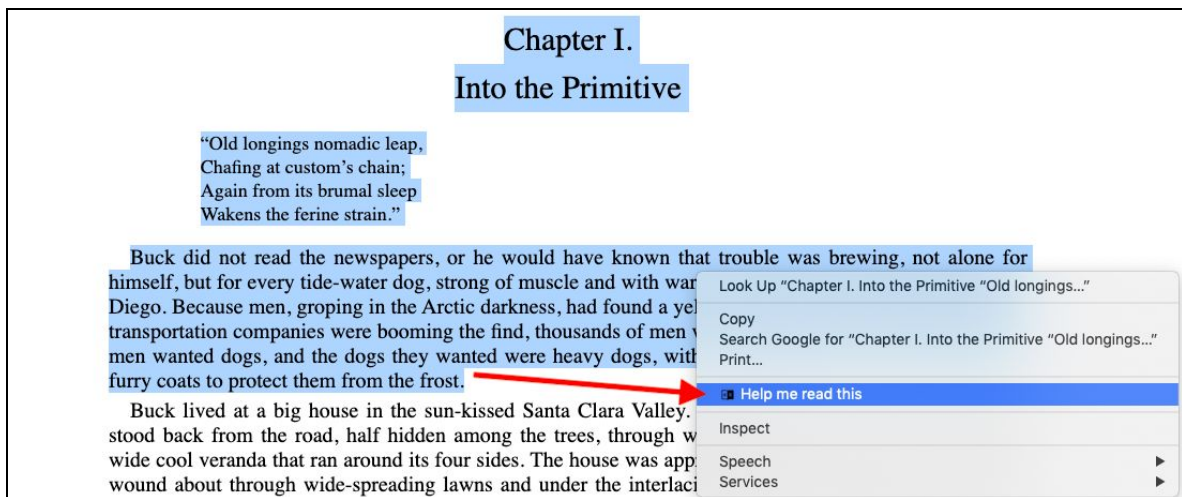

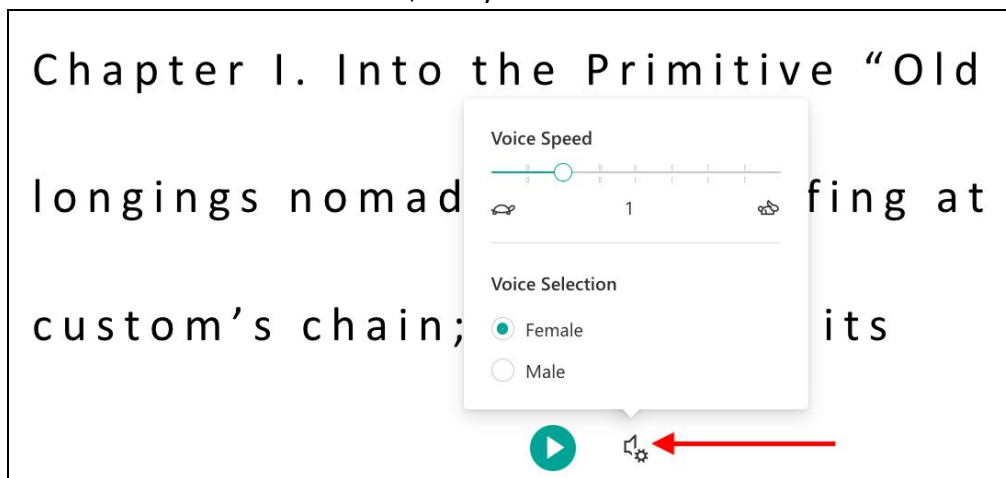
Select the text, right-click on the text and choose **Help me read this**.

(On a Mac - hold down CTRL key and click - a menu pops up)

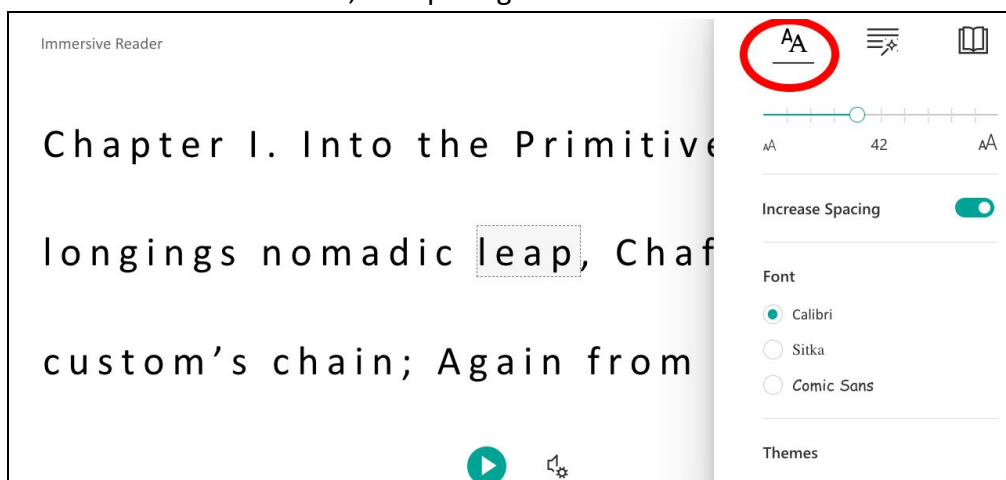
Immersive Reader will read the selected text aloud.



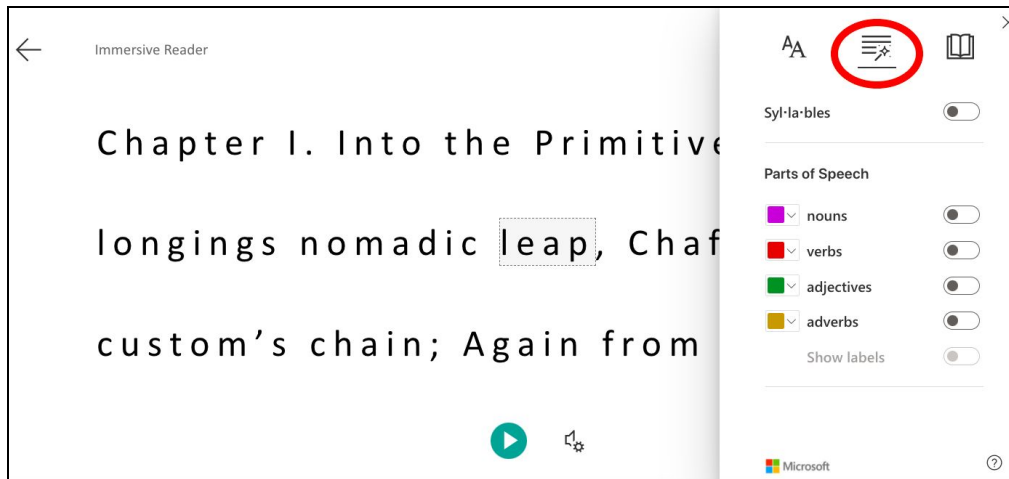
You can choose a male or female voice, and you can choose how fast or slow the text is read.



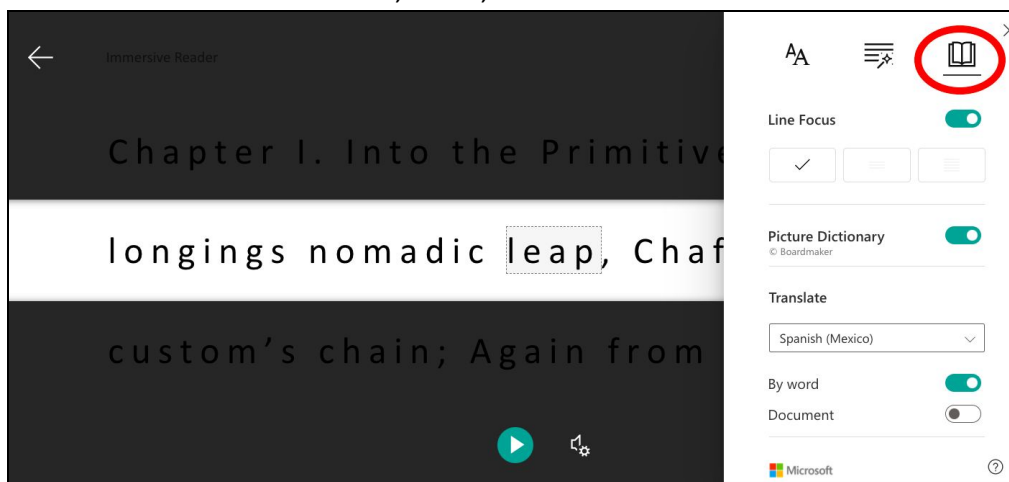
You can change the size & color of the text, the spacing between lines of text and the color of the background.



You can break words down into syllables and color code the words in selected text based on their identified parts of speech.



You can limit the focus to one, three, or five lines at a time as the text is read.



You can enable the picture dictionary then users will see images when clicking on words



You can translate the text into a variety of languages.
