[Guidance on Remote Provision of Special Education Services and Assessments](#)

The DOE is allowing remote special education services to be provided under limited circumstances, which includes during per session or overtime as part of compensatory services, as described in the new [Guidance for Remote Provision of Services and Assessments during the 2022–23 School Year](#) document. Note that the expectation is that services are to be provided in-person for the vast majority of cases and should be treated as a last option only for students who can benefit from remote services.

As a reminder and as shared in the November 1 edition of [Principals Digest](#), all students with IEPs must be considered for compensatory services to address gaps in learning as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and periods of remote/blended learning beginning in March 2020.
